YEARBOOK 2023

The year 2023 ushered in a new era for Tri-County Women Veterans. This was TCWV's first full year as 501c3 non-profit organization. Membership rose to a new high — over 330 women who had served in our nation's armed forces. Reflecting our new status, the TCWV Board of Directors created a Strategic Plan to guide the organization in the coming years.

The year's events kicked off with a Christmas/New Year's Party held on January 16 at the American Legion Post 347. Everyone in attendance enjoyed the food, festivities, entertaining elves, and the White Elephant present exchange. A patriotic-themed celebration on July 17 brought the joys of fellowship and White Elephant shenanigans to a very, very hot summer.

Seeking a natural alternative to traditional therapy, TCWV contracted with an equine therapy group: SADLES Ranch/Code HORSE. Code HORSE offered a rich, therapeutic experience for women who struggle with unresolved issues to find peace, calm, and serenity. Fifteen members participated during the year.

A new venture widened awareness of TCWV throughout the state. TCWV hosted the Florida Department of Veterans Affairs Women Veterans Conference, held June 23-25 at the Brownwood Hotel and Spa in the Villages. We raised the funds to cover all the food for the attendees, finding local sponsors to support the event.

As our Color Guard's reputation grew over the year, so did the number of requests for their involvement in veteran ceremonies and events. They participated in events throughout the three counties and as far away as St. Augustine.

By autumn, our attendance at the general meeting outgrew Palmer Country Club, where we've met for a number of years. For October and November, we held the meeting and potluck luncheon at American Legion Post 18 in Wildwood. In November, TCWV had the honor of hosting a book signing by Vice Admiral Sandra Stosz, author of *Breaking Ice & Breaking Glass: Leading in Uncharted Waters.* During her 40-year career in the Coast Guard, she was the first woman to command an icebreaker on the Great Lakes and to lead a U.S. armed forces service academy. The event was held at Sumter Senior Living, 1490 Killingsworth Way, The Villages, Florida.

We rung out the year with a Christmas celebration at Sumter Senior Living. That White Elephant made a return visit, and everyone enjoyed the festivities. On to another great year!

Leaving employment for the State of Texas, Jan joined the Navy in 1975. She spent most of her career as an analyst and manager in C3I systems in Navy and Joint assignments, including the Pentagon Navy Command Center during Desert Storm and as Branch Chief, C3I Interoperability for the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. She held command three times, the most memorable being Commanding Officer of Naval Station Pascagoula, MS. As a Captain, she was national Operations Officer for the Military Entrance Processing Command when 9/11 struck. Juliette Bridgeman – Army



Sandra "Sandy" Ellert - Navy





Miriam Henoch – Air Force



Vicki Hutchinson - Navy



Mary Ellen Radloff – Army






Debra "Deb' Simmons – Army

Rhonda Storey – Air Force




Diane "Dixie" Thalwitzer – Air Force


Carl Clarke – Ambassador
